





# Kindergarten Registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open

Kindergarten registration for the 2025-2026 school year at Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) schools is now open. DPCDSB offers the Kindergarten program in 125

Catholic elementary schools in Mississauga, Brampton, Caledon, Bolton and Orangeville.

Parents/guardians can register online at <u>dpcdsb.org</u>.

Registration is open to Catholic children and children of Catholic parents. Kindergarten students must be at least four (4) years of age by December 31, 2025.

The following documents are required to complete the registration process:

- Proof of age of the child
- Original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) or original baptismal certificate from a church in full communion with the Holy See of Rome or an Eastern Catholic Church.
- Immunization Reference #'s from the local Public Health Unit
- Proof of Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status
- Proof of home address
- Proof of English Separate School Support

Please refer to the <u>Register for School webpage</u> for accepted forms of documentation.



# 2025-2026 Registration for St. James Catholic Global Learning Centre International Baccalaureate Programmes

Registration for St. James Catholic Global Learning Centre International Baccalaureate Programmes for the 2025-2026 school



St. James Catholic Global Learning Centre is an authorized International Baccalaureate (I.B.) World School which offers the Primary Years Programme (PYP) and Middle Years Programme (MYP). The programmes provide learning opportunities with a global focus for students from Kindergarten to Grade 8. International Baccalaureate programmes aim to develop resilient, self-motivated young people who have the knowledge, skills, and sense of purpose they need to thrive throughout their lives and contribute to making the world a better place.

St. James C.G.L.C. is a regional elementary school open to all DPCDSB Catholic students and is located in southeast Mississauga. Please note that **student transportation is not provided** for this regional school.

As a regional site, St. James C.G.L.C. does not offer online registration through the board's online system. The registration process is outlined on the <u>registration section of the school website</u>. The

completed registration form(s) and supporting documentation can be sent by email to <a href="mailto:St.JamesInfo@dpcdsb.org">St.JamesInfo@dpcdsb.org</a>. In the event the number of applications exceeds the number of allotted spaces, completed applications received by the due date will be subject to the random selection process. To be included in the random selection process, registrations must be received by 3:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 16, 2025.

Admissions are open to Catholic children and children of Catholic parents. Kindergarten students must be at least four (4) years of age by December 31, 2025. If applying to the DPCDSB for the first time, it is recommended that the child first be registered at their home school.

# Parent/Guardian School Volunteers Needed

Parents/guardians are an integral part of our Catholic school communities. Parent/guardian engagement, advocacy and support for Catholic schools gives you a voice, and signals that support for Catholic education in Dufferin-Peel and Ontario is strong. We appreciate the involvement of parents/guardians at the local school and encourage participation in school activities and events. Parent/guardian school volunteer activities include: field trips, lunch events, and other school events.

All parent/guardian school volunteers need to have a Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening on file at the school. If you are interested in volunteering at St. Alfred please



contact the office to obtain a School Volunteer Letter that is submitted to the Police Department as part of your request for a Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening.

Anyone who has not previously submitted a Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening is strongly encouraged to apply as soon as possible to avoid delays. Please allow up to 6 weeks to process the application.

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board has the responsibility, under law, to provide a safe and secure working and learning environment for students and employees. The Board is in a position of trust with regard to students and must protect their intellectual, physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

All individuals are required to provide an original Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening that is satisfactory to the Board prior to the commencement of any duties. The Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening must have been executed within the preceding 6 months of receipt.

#### Once Your Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening is Completed:

Peel Regional Police or your local Police Department will return the results using their preferred method. A copy certified by a Principal or Designate of the school must be held at the School.

Do I have to get a Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening each school year?

No. If you have a Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening on file, you will receive an Annual Offence Declaration (AOD) for the calendar year. This must be signed and returned to the school to keep your Criminal Reference Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening on file current. An AOD may be obtained at the St. Alfred School Main Office.

#### **Snacks and Treats for Classrooms**

We are asking that all parents please refrain from bringing snacks/treats (any edible items) to classroom for sharing amongst students. Several students in our school suffer from severe food allergies to nuts, peanuts, nut products, fish as well as other foods. There is also a Ministry PPM - a memorandum that sets out nutrition standards for food and beverages in publicly funded elementary schools in Ontario. If you would still like to do something special for your child's class, a classroom gift, (e.g. board game) for inclement recess may be a great alternative. Again, we thank you for your cooperation.



# Changes in Weather

As colder weather is upon us, a few friendly reminders. We recognize that temperatures can change throughout the day and suggest that children come dressed in layers. Students need to wear the necessary clothing and shoes/boots in order to ensure they are appropriately dressed for outdoor play during the winter season. During the winter season, many parents/guardians are concerned about school policy on outdoor recess. It is generally accepted that when the wind chill factor drops below -25°C,

students should not go outside for recess. Dufferin-Peel C.D.S.B. policy uses a wind chill of -20°C as the determining temperature for modified recesses. At St. Alfred School, students will remain inside when the wind chill is reported at -25°C or lower and we will modify the duration of recess when the temperature reaches -20°C. As always, ensure your child is prepared for the extremes of winter weather.

# **Snow Stays on the Ground**

The weather and the wonderful pleasures that come with winter have begun. Students are reminded that **snow stays on the ground**. Frequent reminders are made on the morning announcements. Students are encouraged to constructively use the snow that winter brings to build different creations out of the snow. Please assist us by reviewing with your child the dangers of throwing snowballs and the importance of preventing injury to other children. Together, we



will create a school yard which is safe for all during winter. Another important element of constructive play is respecting the efforts of others. Students are reminded to respect the efforts of others (e.g., snow forts, etc.) and to leave those creations for all to enjoy.

# Student Absences - SafeArrival Absence Reporting System

At Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board one of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each and every day.

This is a reminder that here at St. Alfred, we will be using the **SafeArrival** absence reporting system this school year.

Please be informed that parents are required to report student absences prior to the bell time for the current day, future absences, or absences that span 2 or more days up to 5 consecutive days. Absence which exceeds 15 days will need to be communicated with the school office directly.

With **SafeArrival**, you are asked to report your child's absence in advance using any of these 3 convenient methods:

- 1. Using your mobile device, download and install the **SchoolMessenger App** from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at <a href="https://go.schoolmessenger.ca">https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</a>). The first time you use the app, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Once you are signed up and logged in, select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.
- 2. Use the SafeArrival website, <a href="https://go.schoolmessenger.ca">https://go.schoolmessenger.ca</a>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- 3. Call the toll-free number **1 (844) 435-3440** to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time. If further assistance required on how to report an absence using **SafeArrival** can be found on the following link: <a href="https://www.dpcdsb.org/parents/absence-reporting">https://www.dpcdsb.org/parents/absence-reporting</a>

In addition, we will use the **SchoolMessenger Communicate** automated notification system to contact parents whose child is absent when the absence was not reported in advance. The automated notification system will attempt to contact parents at multiple contact points until a reason is submitted for the absence. If our system is unable to reach the designated contacts, office staff will follow up.

If you report your child's absence in advance using the **SafeArrival** toll-free number, website, or mobile app, you will NOT receive these notifications. We appreciate your diligence and attention regarding the reporting of your child's attendance for the upcoming school year.

# **Protocol for Student Accidents, Injuries, Illnesses**

As per Dufferin-Peel General Administrative Procedures (GAP), the Principal of each school is responsible for establishing a communication procedure to parents/guardians for student accidents, injuries, or illnesses.

#### **General Expectations**

All accidents, injuries, and illnesses requiring first aid will be reported to parents/guardians. This communication procedure shall be used regardless of the severity of the accident, injury, or illness. Where an accident, injury, or illness occurs at school, standard first aid treatment shall be given immediately by a qualified First Aider, when available. In the case of an injury, staff shall not move the injured party if there is a suspected back or neck injury as this could potentially cause further damage.

Where an accident, injury, or illness occurs on a school sponsored excursion, first aid treatment shall be given by the excursion provider/location, when available. If a qualified first aid provider is not available, the students' parent/guardian and/or emergency services will be contacted, as appropriate. A staff member shall report any accident or injury to the Principal as soon as possible on the day of the illness, accident, or injury.

If an accident or injury involving a student has occurred while at school but has not been discovered until a later time, the Principal, when informed of such accident or injury, shall inform the parent(s)/guardian(s)/emergency contact and their instructions acted upon, as appropriate.

If the Principal or their delegate believes that the injury or illness may not be of a serious nature, the parent(s)/guardian(s)/emergency contact shall be informed and their instructions acted upon, as appropriate.

#### Serious Accident, Injury, or Illness Response

If the accident, injury, or illness appears to be of a serious nature, which may require diagnosis and/or treatment by a qualified medical practitioner, the following procedures shall apply in the order described below:

- a) An ambulance shall be called immediately (911) to transport the accident/injury victim and/or person experiencing a serious illness to a hospital. A staff member shall accompany the victim to the hospital.
- b) For serious accidents, injuries, and/or illnesses which occur on DPCDSB property during school hours, the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student shall be notified immediately.
- c) Where the accident, injury, or illness involves a student, Emergency Response Services personnel shall be provided with a copy of the Student Index Card.
- d) If a student is admitted to a hospital as a result of an accident or injury, or if the accident or injury results in a serious or fatal injury, DPCDSB's Risk Management and Insurance Officer, Health and Safety Department, will be notified by telephone on the same day as per GAP 519.01 Board Insurance Incident Reports.
- e) Principals shall complete the Ontario School Boards' Insurance Exchange (OSBIE) on-line incident report form as soon as possible. Principals must ensure that the red box at the top of the on-line incident report form is checked.
- f) OSBIE and DPCDSB's Risk Management and Insurance Officer shall receive copies of on-line OSBIE report forms simultaneously. OSBIE prioritizes reports daily and will follow-up with the Principal and/or the Risk Management and Insurance Officer regarding serious or fatal injuries.

# **School Yard Supervision**

A reminder to both parents/guardians and students that yard supervision does not begin until 8:30 a.m. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring student safety.

#### Kiss & Ride

The Kiss and Ride lane is a convenience provided to parents with the intention that parents remain in their cars. If you need to assist your child, or exit your vehicle, please park in a parking spot or on the street in a designated area.

#### Rules to Remember

- Never park in the Kiss and Ride lane and get out of your car.
- Always pull up to the front of the line and let your child out at the sidewalk where the supervising teacher will be standing. Do not let your child out anywhere else!
- If you are parked in the school lot, please wait for the supervising teacher's signal to exit the lot

Thank you for your assistance in making our school the safest it can possibly be for our students!

#### **Valuables**

Students are requested NOT to bring valuables, items of importance or money to school. This includes video games, iPods, phones, expensive sports equipment, etc. The school cannot accept responsibility for valuables brought to school. Personal items should be marked with the child's name.






#### **Fire Drills**

An effective communicator who speaks, writes, and listens honestly and sensitively, responding critically in light of gospel values

A reflective, creative, and holistic thinker who solves problems and makes responsible decisions with an informed moral conscience for the common good

A self-directed, responsible, lifelong learner who develops and demonstrates God-given potential A collaborative contributor who finds meaning, dignity, and vocation in work that respects the rights of all and contributes to the common good

A caring family member who attends to family, school, parish, and the community

A responsible citizen who gives witness to Catholic social teaching by promoting peace, justice, and the sacredness of human life.

#### **Late Students**

#### **Student Information**

Please remember to update the office with any new information regarding your child. The office needs to be advised of any changes to telephone numbers, emergency contacts, and/or address so that we always have the most up-to-date information for your child in case of emergency.

The office must be advised of any medical concerns. All medication must be kept in the office.

## **Emergency Evacuation**

Teachers and students regularly practice emergency evacuation procedures. These include safe exit from the building in the event of a fire, precautions in the event of a bomb threat and safety actions / lock downs to be taken in the event of an intruder alert. In the unforeseen event that we must evacuate the school for emergency purposes, our students will evacuate to B.W. Fleming School.

#### St. Alfred Catholic School Council

Communication between home and school is greatly enhanced by parental involvement with the Catholic School Council. Please note that our Council will be comprised of parents, school staff as well as community and parish representatives. # Pediculosis (Head Lice)

From time to time, there may be cases of pediculosis or head lice in our school. This should not be cause for alarm. Lice are a nuisance, but not hazardous to your child's health. # Allergen Awareness Alert

In addition to our Board Policy, the passing of Sabrina's law serves as a reminder of the seriousness of anaphylactic reactions. It compels a continued call for action and ongoing monitoring of existing practices to support the safety, health and welfare of all students at St. Alfred School. As there are a number of students in our school who have a severe life threatening allergy to nuts, we ask our families to refrain from sending to school any food, etc. that contains nut products (e.g., peanut butter sandwiches, snacks with nuts, etc.). While we cannot guarantee a "Nut Free" or "Allergen Free" environment, you can help to reduce the risk to our students by not sending in peanuts, nuts of any kind, products containing nuts, nut oil, or nut by-products, foods that MAY have come in contact with nuts or nut products and fast food or commercial snacks where the content or exposure to nuts of commercial foods or snacks is unclear (e.g., Timbits). Edible birthday treats will not be shared with students at school. Please do not send cakes, cookies etc. for distribution. Thank you for your cooperation.

# **Storage and Administration of Medication**

Parents are responsible for ensuring that all medication and forms are updated annually. If your child requires medication, please have all pertinent forms completed and returned with the

medication to the office as soon as possible. Parents are reminded that children are NOT allowed to keep medication in their desk, backpack or classroom (with the exception of an epi-pen or puffer if allergies are severe). All dispensing of medication requires medical permission and must be stored in the office.

# Ryan's Law - Ensuring an Asthma Friendly School

We would like to inform you that St. Alfred continues to participate in 'We Share the Air' a Scent Sensitivity Awareness Campaign. There are students in attendance who suffer from life-threatening asthmatic conditions to air pollutants. Exposure even to minimal odours may cause potential life-threatening reactions. Very common severe chemical triggers are: perfume, cologne, scented products and personal care products (such as hairspray). These products may cause severe reactions for students. The safety and well-being of all of our students is a priority. In order to ensure the safety and well-being of all students, we request that our school community refrain from wearing scented personal products complying with our Scent Free Zone Campaign at school and all school events. Please ensure that all caregivers are also aware of our awareness campaign. If you have any questions, please talk to your child's teacher or the schools staff.

# **Custody of Children**

On rare occasions, we are faced with difficult situations in which non-custodial parents arrive at our school asking to visit with their child or take their child home after school. We are best able to serve and protect the child when we are made aware of legal custody arrangements, visitation rights and special instructions. If legal custody matters affect your family, please ensure that our office and classroom teachers are aware of custodial agreements between parents. We require that a copy of all legal documentation be kept in your child's school records.
